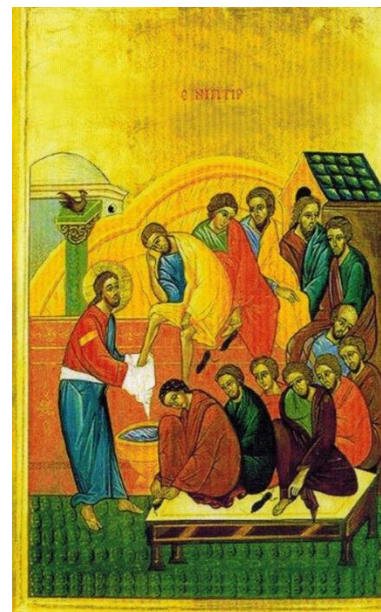

ITEMS USED AT MASS AND LITURGIES

1. Special vessels used in Mass:

- The **chalice** is the cup that holds the wine for consecration and communion.
- The **paten** is a plate that holds the bread, a.k.a. *host*, for consecration and communion.
- The **ciborium** is a special vessel used to hold the bread [*host*] for communion of the people. It has a lid or cover.
- The **cruet** is the small jar that contains the water or wine to be used at Mass. Cruets are usually made of glass or ceramic, and some with a handle. Also: **cruets and tray**.

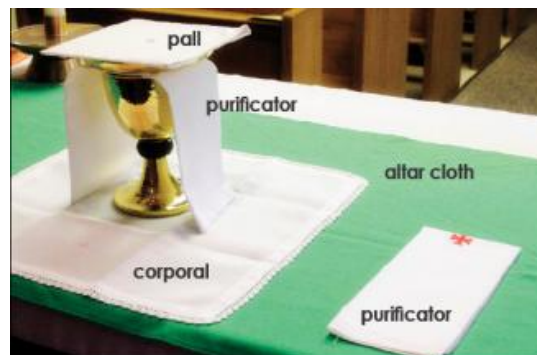

2. The linens used in Mass:

- The **corporal** is a white cloth that is spread upon the altar during Mass to hold the chalice, paten and ciboria.
- The **pall** is a small, square, protective cover of stiffened cloth placed on the chalice during Mass.
- The **purificator** is a white linen cloth which the priest used to wipe out the chalice during Mass.
- The **finger towel**, or hand towel, is a cloth napkin used to dry the priest's hands, that is, after he washed his hands using the **lavabo bowl**.



3. The following furniture items may be found in the sanctuary:

- The **presider's chair** is the chair from which the priest presides during the liturgy of the word and during the concluding prayers of the Mass.
- The **lectern** is a stand from which the priest or another minister reads or speaks to the congregation. The stand used for the scripture readings and the homily (or sermon) is also called the **pulpit** or an **ambo**.
- The **altar** is the holy table from which the priest presides over the liturgy of the Eucharist. It is covered with an **altar cloth**.
- The **credence table** is another name for the side table in the sanctuary where the wine and water cruets, communion patens, etc., are kept during Mass when they are not being used.
- The **gifts table** is the table that holds the bread [*host*] and wine before it is presented to the altar. (This is also called the **offertory table**.)
- The **pew** is a long bench with a back, placed in rows to seat the congregation.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: where a child falls in love with God!

Introduction: The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd [CGS] is a program of Christian formation for children ages 3 through 12. It begins with the understanding that there is a deep bond between God and each child. Based on the teaching methods of *Maria Montessori* and drawing on the most essential elements of scripture and liturgy, Catechesis of the Good Shepherd helps children to name, explore and deepen this relationship as the foundation for their lives.

In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, the classroom, called the **atrium**, is a spiritual environment - a place of worship rather than a traditional classroom. It is perceived as '*holy ground*' where Christ may be encountered in Word and Action; a place for community and worship where the spiritual life of the child is nurtured; and a place of work that becomes prayer and conversation with God. It is a prepared environment where children grow in the knowledge of Jesus and His love. The work in the atrium prepares them for involvement in the larger worshipping community.

The hands-on materials in the atrium encourage children to explore and deepen their experiences at their own pace. The children are free to work with materials that represent the essence of the Christian message, manifest in both scripture and liturgy. The adult's role is to prepare the environment; present works that call forth the child's response; then step back, allowing God and the child to work together.

The vision for this faith experience began in Rome in 1954 with *Dr. Sofia Cavalletti*, a Hebrew Scripture scholar and her co-worker, *Gianna Gobbi*, a Montessori educator. It has now spread internationally. It is present in Canada in many parts of Ontario, as well as Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and BC.

The Training: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd requires training for adults for each level. **LEVEL I** is for children 3-6. **LEVEL II** is for children ages 6-9. **LEVEL III** is for children ages 9-12. Each level of training requires at least 90 hours of training sessions with the following features: *lectures, prayer reflections, observations, lesson presentations, materials making, discussions and planning.*

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Formation Course, Level I (foundation for all other Levels). 10 sessions Oct, 2017 to June 2018 at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish. The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a program of Christian formation for children aged 3-12 years that is based on the **Bible and Liturgy** of the church. Inspired by the principles of Montessori education, it was begun in Rome in 1954 by *Dr Sofia Cavalletti*, author of *The Religious Potential of the Child* and has spread throughout the world. The formation is ideal for catechists, parents, and anyone interested in learning more about their faith. It is growing in the Archdioceses of Winnipeg and St. Boniface and has been endorsed by both Archbishops.
