Connecting...in a Media World

April 29th 5th Sunday of Easter:

On reading the Bible, which comes from the Greek word βιβλία, *biblia*, which means, ‘the books’:

What people love to do on the internet is to take some passage from the Bible and say, “but the Bible says *this*...” [quoting] one line or one phrase or one verse. [I recommend that you] *never* take that [way of reading the Bible] seriously. That is *never* a good way to read the Bible. [Why not?] Because the Bible has to be read in its *totality*. What we look for are not individual isolated passages. [What] we look for [are] the great patterns and trajectories within the books, [the great patterns] through which the wisdom of God is breathing. Through all the inspired books, looking at patterns and trajectories, then we come to know what the Bible truly teaches. [The proper question with which to read the Bible isn’t,] “What’s *in* the Bible?”—there’s a lot of stuff *in* the Bible—but “What does the Bible *teach*?” There’s a difference [between those two questions.] For example, if you look at the beginning of Genesis and you take it perfectly literally, light [it would seem to suggest that there’s] light before there’s the sun. God says “Let there be light” on Day One and it’s only on Day Four that the sun comes around. That’s *in* the Bible, but let me suggest that it’s not what the Bible is *teaching*. The Bible doesn’t really care about astronomy at that point. Look for patterns and trajectories within the collection of books, [deep patterns and trajectories running through all the books] through which the wisdom of God is breathing. That’s a better way to approach Bible reading.

... When people make objections about the Bible [on the internet] and I try to respond with some of these clarifications, what do I hear invariably in response? “You’re just *cherry-picking*, you’re just picking the little elements of Bible that you like and you’re [minimizing the importance of the parts you don’t like].” No. What I am doing is trying to read the Bible, the *books*, responsibly within an interpretive tradition.

Let me clarify what I mean. Suppose you have a kid who is bright, 13 or 14 years old, a good reader, loves to read novels and poetry: would you just say, “Here’s *Hamlet*—knock yourself out. Here’s *Hamlet*, just read it, and I trust you’ll be able to figure out pretty much all of it on your own”? Of course not. First of all, a lot of the words themselves would go over his head, but then, *a fortiori*, the *thematics* of *Hamlet*, what *Hamlet* means in the richest sense, the *humanism* of *Hamlet*, the *theology* implicit in *Hamlet*, *Hamlet* and its view of human nature and of the soul...of course he wouldn’t get that. You wouldn’t just hand him the book and say, “*Read*.” What would you say? “Start working with a good commentary that reflects a long interpretive tradition around *Hamlet*, and then as you get older read ever more sophisticated interpretations of *Hamlet*, maybe go watch several versions of *Hamlet*, and then with a group discuss what it means.”

What’s my point? You don’t just say, “Pick up *Hamlet* on your own and read it.” In the same way we Catholics don’t think it’s wise to just pick up the books of the Bible, the *biblia*, and say “Just read it, you’ll do fine.” No, we think it should be read within this great complex ancient interpretive tradition which we call the Church.

1. **Regarding Ste Rose's AGM.** At the AGM last Thursday a vote was taken whether Ste Rose Church ought to ask the Archdiocese to hand over the Grotto property to the municipality of Ste Rose du Lac, and those attending voted very favorably. Keep in mind that the Archdiocese, and *not* Ste Rose de Lima Church, must make the ultimate decision, and the Archdiocese may have concerns we have not considered.
2. **Regarding Confirmations.** Archbishop Richard Gagnon is in Ste Rose this weekend to confirm eight of our young parishioners. Please pray for these young women and men as they move into a new life-phase of greater Christian responsibility—we all know it is a difficult transition. 3. **Regarding Sunday evening masses.** I am bringing to an end my experiment with Sunday evening Masses in Ste Rose, concluding that such masses are not presently required.
