The Unborn is a Human Being

The truth of this statement is self evident, but nonetheless has been questioned by those who have a vested interest in the taking of unborn life. The Bible is quite explicit:

For you (God) created my inmost being; You knit me together in my mother's womb...My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place.

-Psalm 139:13-15

The psalmist David, who wrote this psalm, refers to himself in the womb as "I" and "me", making it clear that he himself was there, not something that turned into him at birth.

16th SUNDAY in Ordinary Time July 23rd 2017

The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed...

While men delight in bulk and ostentation, God delights in what is small and hidden. It seems that, in Jesus' mind, the Kingdom and smallness always go hand in hand. "Unless you turn and become like children you will never enter the Kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). This may be because God wants to fill all things with his goodness, and in what is lowly he finds no obstruction. And yet again it may be because smallness and hiddenness in this world best correspond to what God is in himself, so that God, in coming to this world, naturally gravitates toward what is most like himself: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:3). In order to talk most faithfully about the Kingdom of his Father, time and again he resorts to the lowliness of seeds and soil and slow growth. How at home and knowledgeable Jesus appears to be while speaking in this way! According to him, we are to find the entire *Kingdom of the heavens* (note the expansive use of the plural here) in a mere grain of mustard seed, which will stick to your hand inadvertently or fly off of to the ground unnoticed.

A *grain* of mustard is but a fraction of the mustard "seed" itself. The mustard "shrub" can in fact grow up to reach some nine feet in height, or even twelve feet near the Lake of Galilee. And both its final growth and its pungency are wholly disproportionate to its initial size. Such a marvel of the natural order suffices for Jesus to make of the dynamic mustard seed a fit analogy, not only for the Father's Kingdom, but also for the act of faith: "If you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, you will say to this mountain, 'move hence to yonder place,' and it will move; and nothing will be impossible for you" (Mt 17:20). 'Have the faith of a grain of mustard seed', says Jesus. 'Think small; concentrate all your energies in one direction; waste no time comparing your size to that of others; be persistent in your growth; desire to be nothing but what God has put in your own nature, humble as this may appear; absorb gratefully every ray of the sun and every hint of moisture; and, after a lifetime of such modest effort, you will become ... a paradise where the many may dwell. To be a shady refuge for others will be your own highest reward!'"

What is highest, most sublimely all-encompassing, and constitutes God's proper dwelling place – "the kingdom of the heavens" – is contemplated by Jesus in what is lowest, smallest, and best stimulates an earthly creature's palate. It takes the vision of the Word in whom all things were created to see the greatest magnitude in the tiniest compass, the heavenly in the earthy, and to teach us to see as he sees: "God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom"

(1 Cor 1:28-30a).

Dear Parishioners of Ste. Rose, Laurier and McCreary,

Re: Sharing God's Gifts Appeal 2017

This year the Archdiocese has restructured its finances, in this restructuring the targets for the Parish Appeal has been reduced. A letter from our Archbishop Richard Gagnon was sent to all Parishes April 2nd explaining the changes in the process of the Appeal and the distribution of funds for Pastoral Ministries within the Archdiocese.

Targets for SGG this year 2017 are as follows: Ste. Rose \$8,420 Laurier \$2,410 McCreary \$1,890

Assessment (16% of Sunday Collection 2015) is as follows: Ste Rose \$13,220, Laurier \$3,780, McCreary \$2,970
It will be to our advantage to add SGG and the assessment and raise the total amount under SGG.

Given this the following would be our targets: **Ste Rose \$21,640 Laurier \$6,190 McCreary \$4,860**

Please note that any funds over Target come back to the Parish without being taxed 16%.

Since in the past the Stewardship method of giving has been fruitful, we could continue the same i.e.

Stewardship giving of income: 90% your needs 5% your Parish 3% other charities 2% Sharing God's Gifts

Additional notes for Ste. Rose – your support is needed at this time for the roof. Some of you are aware of the leaks, and some major funding would be required for this project. Given this it would be helpful to go over our target. Thank you for your attention and support. Be assured of our prayers for you and your families.
