WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY ABOUT UNBORN LIFE?

The Bible gives us a primary scripture that deals with all of human life:

***Then God said “Let us make man in our image, in our likeness”...So
God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him;
male and female he created them.***

Genesis 1:26,27

This passage makes two powerful points: first, that man is a created being, a special being, a unique being.

The second is that man is the very reflection of his glorious creator, and a being who by his very nature has worth, honor, importance, and dignity.

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY JULY 9TH 2017

Scripture lessons: **In the first reading**, the prophet Zechariah consoles the Jews living in Palestine under Greek rule, promising them a “meek” Messianic King of peace riding on a donkey, who will give them rest and liberty.

The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 145) praises and thanks a kind and compassionate God Who “*raises up those who are bowed down*” under heavy yokes. **In the second reading**, Paul tells the first-century Roman Christian community about two yokes, namely, the “flesh” and the “Spirit,” and he challenges them to reject the heavy and fatal yoke of the flesh and accept the light yoke of the Spirit of Jesus. Christian spirituality, according to Paul, proceeds from the initiative of the Holy Spirit and means living in the realm of the “Spirit” as opposed to the “flesh.”

In the Gospel, Jesus offers rest to those “*who labor and are burdened*” if they will accept his “*easy yoke and light burden*.” By declaring that his “*yoke is light*,” Jesus means that whatever God sends us is made to fit our needs and our abilities exactly. The second part of Jesus’ claim is: “*My burden is light*.” Jesus does not mean that the burden is easy to carry, but that it is laid on us in love, that it is meant to be carried in love, and that love makes even the heaviest burden light. “**Why me?**” When we are tested with trials we ask God Why me? And we fail to count the innumerable blessings that we have received. Arthur Ashe, the legendary Wimbledon player was dying of AIDS which he got due to infected blood received during a heart surgery in 1983. From the world over, he received letters from his fan, one of them conveyed: “Why does God have to select you for such a bad disease?” To this Arthur Ashe replied: The world over--50,000,000 children start playing tennis, 5,000,000 learn to play tennis, 500,000 learn professional tennis, 50,000 come to the circuit, 5000 reach the grand slam, 50 reach the Wimbledon, 4 to semi-finals, 2 to finals. When I was the one holding the cup, I never asked god “Why me?”. And today in pain, I should not be asking GOD “why me?”

Life messages: **1) We need to unload our burdens on the Lord.** This “unloading” is the main purpose of our personal and family prayers and one of the functions of Divine Worship in the Church. During our daily prayers in the evening, we ask God’s forgiveness for the sins and failures of day and receive the consoling assurance that we are reconciled with God and our fellow human beings. During the Holy Mass in our parish Church, we place our stress-filled lives on the altar and allow Jesus to cool down the overheated radiators of our hectic lives. We also unload the burdens of our sins and worries on the altar and offer them and ourselves to God during the Holy Mass. **2) We need to be freed from unnecessary burdens:** Jesus lays the light burden of his commandment of love on us and yokes us with himself, giving us his strength through the Holy Spirit to fulfill that commandment. Jesus is also interested in lifting off our backs the burdens that suck the life out of us, so that he can place around our necks his own us

yoke that brings to us and to others through us, new life, new energy, and new joy. We are called, not only to find peace, refreshment and rest for ourselves, but also to live the kind of life through which others, too, may find God’s peace, God’s refreshing grace, and the joy of placing their lives in God’s hands.

Thank you for the prayers, masses and to the prayer chain, flowers, cards, visits, and phone calls received. To the “angels” who looked after my furry friend and the angel who cut the lawn these three weeks while my stay in Dauphin hospital. It is all much appreciated! Dear Parishioners of Ste. Rose, Laurier and McCreary,
Re: Sharing God's Gifts Appeal 2017

This year the Archdiocese has restructured its finances, in this restructuring the targets for the Parish Appeal has been reduced. A letter from our Archbishop Richard Gagnon was sent to all Parishes April 2nd explaining the changes in the process of the Appeal and the distribution of funds for Pastoral Ministries within the Archdiocese.

Targets for SGG this year 2017 are as follows: Ste. Rose \$8,420 Laurier \$2,410 McCreary \$1,890

Assessment (16% of Sunday Collection 2015) is as follows: Ste Rose \$13,220, Laurier \$3,780, McCreary \$2,970
It will be to our advantage to add SGG and the assessment and raise the total amount under SGG.

Given this the following would be our targets: **Ste Rose \$21,640 Laurier \$6,190 McCreary \$4,860**

Please note that any funds over Target come back to the Parish without being taxed 16%.

Since in the past the Stewardship method of giving has been fruitful, we could continue the same i.e.

Stewardship giving of income: 90% your needs 5% your Parish 3% other charities 2% Sharing God's Gifts

Additional notes for Ste. Rose – your support is needed at this time for the roof. Some of you are aware of the leaks, and some major funding would be required for this project. Given this it would be helpful to go over our target. Thank you for your attention and support. Be assured of our prayers for you and your families.
