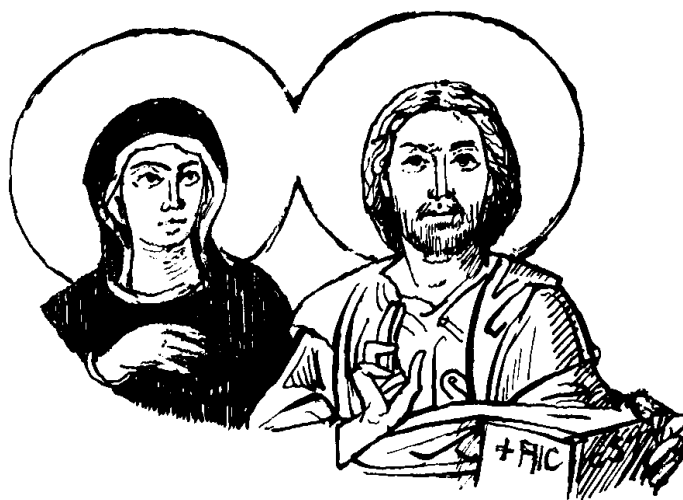

“40 DAYS FOR LIFE” Devotional by Carmen Pate, Truth in Action Ministries www.40daysforlife.com

Intention: Pray for fathers who participated in the decision to abort their child, and for those who did not have a voice, that they would find freedom and healing in Christ.

Prayer: Dear Heavenly Father, we pray for young men who participated in the termination of their child and are broken as You are over their loss.

Forgive their sin Lord, and bring opportunity for healing and renewal of their minds in Christ Jesus. For those suffering from an abortion they did not choose, restore their joy as they learn to forgive others and trust You with their future. In the name of Christ, who heals the broken hearted, Amen.

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time June 10th:

If Christianity is true then it ought to follow (a) That any Christian will be nicer than the same person if he were not Christian. (b) That any man who becomes a Christian will be nicer than he was before. [But that some particular non-Christian happens to be nicer than some particular Christian does not prove that Christianity is untrue.] Christian Miss Bates may have an unkind tongue than unbelieving Dick Firkin. That, by itself, does not tell us whether Christianity works. The question is what Miss Bates' tongue would be like if she were not a Christian and what Dick's would be like if he became one. Miss Bates and Dick, as a result of natural causes and early upbringing, have certain temperaments: Christianity professes to put both temperaments under new management if they will allow it to do so. We [should not think that since Dick is nice then] he is all right; as if Christianity were something nasty people needed and nice ones could afford to do without; and as if niceness was all that God demanded. But that would be a fatal mistake. The truth is that in God's eyes Dick Firkin needs 'saving' every bit as much as Miss Bates...

You cannot expect God to look at Dick's placid temper and friendly disposition exactly as we do. They result from natural causes which God Himself creates. Being merely temperamental, they will all disappear if Dick's digestion alters. The niceness, in fact, is God's gift to Dick, not Dick's gift to God. In the same way, God has allowed natural causes, working in a world spoiled by centuries of sin, to produce in Miss Bates the narrow mind and jangled nerves which account for most of her nastiness. He intends, in his own good time, to set that part of her right. But that is not, for God, the critical part of the business. It is not what He is anxious about. What He is watching and waiting and working for in Miss Bates and Dick Firkin is this: will they, or will they not, turn to Him and thus fulfill the only purpose for which they were created? Will they offer their natures to God? The question of whether the natures they offer or withhold are, at that moment, nice or nasty ones, is of secondary importance. God can see to that part of the problem.

God created Dick's sound nerves and good digestion, and there is plenty more where they come from. It costs God nothing, so far as we know, to create nice things: but to convert rebellious wills cost His crucifixion. And because they are wills they can—in nice people just as much as nasty ones—refuse His request. Dick has the chance to turn (or rather, to allow God to turn) the temporary pattern [of his good temper] into the beauty of an eternal spirit: and so far he has not taken it.

There is a paradox here. As long as Dick does not turn to God, he thinks his niceness is his own, and just as long as he thinks that, it is not his own. It is when Dick realizes that his niceness is not his own but a gift from God, and when he offers it back to God—it is just then that it begins to be really his own. The only things we can keep are the things we freely give to God. What we try to keep for ourselves is just what we are sure to lose.
