12th Sunday in ordinary time (June 25): Jer 20:10-13; Rom 5:12-15; Matthew 10:26-33

Introduction: Our Scripture readings for this Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time challenge us to preach Christ through our words and lives without fear.

"Don't be afraid! We have four bishops to pray for us."

An elderly woman named Maude had a window seat on a big 747 jetliner that had just taken off for Rome from New York. She had been saving for years to fulfill her dream to visit the Eternal City. But it was her first flight, and she was terrified. Even the stately presence of four bishops seated behind her didn't help. With fear and trembling she finally opened her eyes and peered out the window, just in time to see one of the plane's four engines break loose from the wing and disappear into the clouds. "We're going to die!" she cried out. "We're going to die!" The stewardess consulted with the pilot who announced to the passengers that everything was under control that they could fly back to New York and land safely with three engines. But Maude continued to cry out, "We're going to die!" The stewardess went to her and said, "Don't worry, my dear, God is with us. We have only three engines, but look, we have four bishops to pray for us." To which Maude replied, "I'd rather have four engines and three bishops!" In today's Gospel Jesus gives us three reasons why we should not be afraid and why we should have the courage of our Christian convictions.

13th Sunday in ordinary time (July 2):

"He who loves father and mother more than me is not worthy of me"

True love overflows in kindness and mercy towards others

True love for God compels us to express charity (merciful deeds of kindness and goodness) towards our neighbors who are also loved by God because he created each of them in his image and likeness. Mother Theresa of Calcutta once told a marvelous story about a destitute family who had nothing to eat for days. When news of their impoverished condition came to the *Missionary Sisters of Charity*, Mother Theresa personally went to their home and brought them some food supplies. The mother of the family immediately divided the food in half and carried it off. When she returned, Mother Theresa asked her, "Where did you go?" She gave the simple answer, "To my neighbors, they are hungry also!" Mother Theresa said, "I was not surprised that she gave - poor people are really very generous. I was surprised that she knew they were hungry. As a rule, when we are suffering, we are so focused on ourselves, we have no time for others."

Dear Parishioners of Ste. Rose, Laurier and McCreary,
Re: Sharing God's Gifts Appeal 2017

This year the Archdiocese has restructured its finances, in this restructuring the targets for the Parish Appeal has been reduced. A letter from our Archbishop Richard Gagnon was sent to all Parishes April 2nd explaining the changes in the process of the Appeal and the distribution of funds for Pastoral Ministries within the Archdiocese.

Targets for SGG this year 2017 are as follows: Ste. Rose \$8,420 Laurier \$2,410 McCreary \$1,890

Assessment (16% of Sunday Collection 2015) is as follows: Ste Rose \$13,220, Laurier \$3,780, McCreary \$2,970
It will be to our advantage to add SGG and the assessment and raise the total amount under SGG.

Given this the following would be our targets: **Ste Rose \$21,640 Laurier \$6,190 McCreary \$4,860**

Please note that any funds over Target come back to the Parish without being taxed 16%.

Since in the past the Stewardship method of giving has been fruitful, we could continue the same i.e.

Stewardship giving of income: 90% your needs 5% your Parish 3% other charities 2% Sharing God's Gifts

Additional notes for Ste. Rose – your support is needed at this time for the roof. Some of you are aware of the leaks, and some major funding would be required for this project. Given this it would be helpful to go over our target. Thank you for your attention and support. Be assured of our prayers for you and your families.
